Current issues in behaviour genetics

James Stevenson is Professor of Psychology at the University of Southampton and an adjunct Professor at the Regional Centre for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, University of Bergen. His research areas are behaviour genetics, paediatric psychology and developmental psychopathology. James Stevenson's interest in the field of behaviour genetics is the role of genetic and environmental influences on aspects of behavioural, emotional and cognitive development. Furthermore, he is interested in the impact of illness and disability on psychological development (paediatric psychology), as well as in the developmental origins of behaviour problems in young children (developmental psychopathology). James Stevenson was the founding Editor of the 'Annual Research Review Issue' of the Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry. In addition, he was one of the six editors of the 5th Edition of Rutter's 'Child and Adolescent Psychiatry'. This is the definitive text book in the field and was published by Blackwell in 2008.
